# Union Ponders Labor Charges

The [American Guild of Musical Artists](#) said it would consider filing unfair labor practice charges with the National Labor Relations Board against New York City Opera after that company's board voted on Friday to cut staffing and move from its Lincoln Center home. Alan Gordon, the union's national executive director, said the group might also seek an injunction to keep the company from using the name New York City Opera. George Steel, the [opera's](#) general manager and artistic director, said on Friday that the move, the layoffs and the cuts to the production schedule were required to keep the company running and to ensure "a foundation for sustainable growth." **RACHEL LEE HARRIS**
